SHELBY CO. PRE-BREAK INVITATIONAL

The Running Titans traveled to County High on Mar. 27th for the Shelby County Pre-Break Invitational. The girls' team which again competed without a full squad, scored 26 points to finish 14th out of 18 teams. Only four girls scored for the Titans. Senior Grace Nelson got a personal record (PR) in the 800 to run down Franklin Co. senior Rylee Schaffner in the final 50 meters to win by .26 seconds in 2:26.24. Fellow senior Michele Burgess finished fifth in a PR 2:43.10 to give Collins 14 points in the event which represented 54% of their total points. Junior Sophie Bolin was dogged for three laps by Franklin's Schaffner but pulled away with an outdoor PR of 11:59.19 to win by 34 seconds. Collins' other scorer was senior Luci Renda who placed seventh in the high jump (4-2).

The boys scored 38 points to finish ninth out of 16 teams. Collins got scoring from five boys as seniors DaVaughn Wilson and Nathan Janes scored in two events. Janes placed second in both the pole vault (12-6) and 400 (PR 53.20). Wilson placed third in the shot put (41-7) and fifth in the discus (100-3). Senior Chase Delaney and his brother, sophomore Reece, both scored in the 1600. Chase got a PR 4:37.46 to finish fourth, while Reece was close on his heels in 4:39.67 to finish fifth. Sophomore Ethan Kuzman finished sixth in the 3200 with a PR 11:15.06 to round out the scoring for Collins.
