The Running Titans traveled to St. Xavier on April 27th to compete in the Brother Borgia / Coach Cooper Invitational. The boys 4 X 800 relay got off to a fast start as senior Jack Fuhrmann got his fastest 800 split of the season (2:04.5). Freshman Reece Delaney took the baton next and kept the Titans in contention for a scoring spot (top eight) with his best leg of the season (2:07.5). Senior Melbyn Velasquez ran one of his best legs of the year (2:06.5) for third leg. Junior Nathan Janes anchored in 2:04.5. This time Janes did not have to dive at the finish line to beat the previous Collins best. The Titans time of 8:24.21 was good for sixth place and a new school record. Their time toppled the previous mark of 8:27.31 which was set 11 years ago.
