Border Battle

Collins hosted the Border Battle on Sept. 13th which featured the seventh inter-school district competition in Kentucky state history. The Shelby County School District's Team Shelby (Collins and Shelby County) battled the Oldham County School District's Team Oldham (Oldham County and South Oldham). The meet was held at Collins Head Coach George Sanderlin's Blue Meadow Farms' Bullskin Athletic Complex off Joyes Station Rd. in Shelbyville.

Collins senior Emma Kendall won the girls' race for the second straight year. She missed running against her nemesis, senior Abigail Crask of South Oldham, who had a previous commitment. The second Titan across the line for the girls was junior Sophie Bolin who ran a course best of 21:19 to give Collins the one-two punch. Senior Grace Nelson was next in fifth place. Placing three girls in the top five gave Collins 39 points. That was good for second place out of four teams. Oldham County won with a low 30 point score.

Esther Van Zee was Shelby County's top finisher in fourth with a time of 24:42 for 18th place.

The boys' race finish was exciting as Collins senior Chase Delaney battled South Oldham junior Rick Mshindi down the final 150 meters as both athletes finished with a time of 17:02.70. However, in the photo finish, Mshindi took second with Delaney third. Oldham County senior Sean Crady won in 16:58.3. Collins' top three runners got course bests, as sophomore Reece Delaney was fifth (17:28) and junior George Diakhate was seventh (18:32). Vance Boyd (22nd) and Ethan Kuzman (24th) were the final two Titan scorers. South Oldham won the boys race with 35 points and Oldham Co. (42 points) was second. Collins finished with 53 points in third and Shelby County had 109 points in fourth.

Shelby County's top finishing boy was senior Jace McDowell in 23rd place (20:49).
